Introduction

Mashal is a non-profit organization based in Bihar and founded in 2000. Committed to accompany and to enable the marginalized communities to affirm and uphold their rights and dignity, Mashal has set a goal of awareness building, education and empowerment of women and adolescent girls, especially among the most underprivileged groups of the Indian Caste System, through community based organizations of women and girls and experience-based participatory mode of training, workshops, and exposure programs towards developing confidence, self-worth, leadership to enable them to become change agents for the transformation of our society.

Background Information

Bihar is the third most populous state of India with total population of 104,099,452 (54,278,157 male and 49,821,295 female). Nearly 89% of Bihar's population lives in rural areas. Female literacy rate is only 53.33%. The project is to be implemented in the most backward regions. According to the survey reported by census 2011 the sex ratio of Sheikhpura is 930; in East Champaran it is 902 and in West Champaran it is 909 per 1000 male. The female literacy rate of Sheikhpura is 34.13; of East Champaran is 24.65 in West Champaran; 25.85. According to school report card by MHRD, Dropout rate in class 5th is in Sheikhpura 8.59, in East Champaran 13.43 and in West Champaran 17.94, but the dropout rate in 10th class in Sheikhpura is 18.11, in East Champaran it is 57.5, in West Champaran it is 31.71. There are various reasons for girls to be out of schools and for being dropouts. In the villages parents prefer boys going to schools and deprive the girls from attending schools. Still parents didn't understand the importance of girls' education. Thus, little girls are expected to care for the younger siblings or help their parents to earn their livelihood. Women have no voice in decision making especially in the areas of education, health care and marriage. Safety of girls is also a reason to increase the dropout rate of girls. Government schools are still struggling in terms of good infrastructure & qualified teachers.

The central government and the state government have launched many schemes such as MDM, Sabla, Beti Bachao, Beti Padhao, cycle scheme, free dress and books schemes, scholarship schemes etc. for increasing attendance, enrolment & subsequently reducing the rate of dropout children. Civil society organizations are also working as a support system and focusing on reduction of girl's dropout that is a major concern in education especially in the rural areas.

All the three intervention districts i.e East Champaran, West Champaran & Sheikhpura are some of the low performing districts of Bihar in various education indicators. This program would be relevant to understand and capture the lesson learnt from the initiative taken by CBO women, parents, and adolescent girls to ensure girl's enrolment, retention at school & completion of education cycle.

In the previous year (2017) in collaboration with UNICEF, Mashal worked on Community Based Awareness Generation Initiative on Ensuring Enrolment of Dropouts and Retention of Girls in School. Under this programme Mashal covered 15 villages from Sheikhpura block and 15 villages from Ariari block of Sheikhpura district, 20 villages from Raxual block and 15 villages from Paharpur blocks of East Champaran and 15 villages from Nauatan block of West Champaran. The outcome/result of this work was that ten thousand parents and community members increased their knowledge and became aware on RTE and importance of girls' education. 1085 girls vulnerable to becoming dropouts were identified and their attendance was regularized in the schools, 275 out of school and dropout girls were mapped out and enrolled in different schools, and 700 adolescent girls were sensitized on their right to education and were motivated to attend school regularly. But still several girls were deprived of education and very far from formal and basic education. In the year 2018 Mashal continued working with the marginalized communities to deepen their awareness on RTE with its new amendment of 2017 and to ensure enrolment of dropouts and retention of Girls in School.

Programme Location:

The project was implemented in 80 villages of 3 districts of Bihar, namely Sheikhpura, East Champaran, West Champaran, from May, 2018 to January 2019

The Overall Goal of the Programme:

1. Ensuring Enrolment of Out of School/ Dropouts and Retention of Girls in Schools
2. Ensuring active participation of community members, parents, CBOs, and girls to improve the educational status of the children especially girls with regular attendance

Objectives:

- Awareness Generation on girls' education and RTE, with specific focus on reducing dropout
- Sensitizing girls on the importance of education and building self-confidence and motivation to make decision regarding their right to education
- Mapping of OSC/dropouts and children vulnerable to becoming school dropout
- Developing community members, especially parents as support and pressure groups on education in the village
- Collection of Human Interest Stories

The activities conducted during the project period as follows:

- Orientation program for the project personnel
- One day training for CBO women on RTE
- One day Tola meeting on RTE
- Life Skill Training for adolescent girls,
- One-day –workshop for Adolescent Girls on RTE
- Collecting the data of out of school, dropout and irregular girls
- Getting OSC enrolled in School
- Enrolment of dropout girls in BBOSE
- Collecting the human interest stories
- Planning, Monitoring and Review

One day orientation program for the programme personnel

Process:

- Orientation of the project Objectives, Activities, Outcome Indicators and Impact
- Discussion on survey format
- Discussion on how to write case studies
- Discussion on report writing

One day orientation programme was conducted at Mashal Centre, Patna. 20 staff members with unit in-charge Sisters participated in the programme from Raxual, Gahiri and Sheikhpura units. Orientation program was divided into 2 sessions. In the first session Sr. Jyotisha, Director of Mashal, explained the objectives, activities and outcome indicators of the programme and the programme coordinator taught them how to write case studies and report.

The second session was taken by Mrs. Pramila Manoharan and S. A. Moin from UNICEF. Mrs. Pramila started the session with an introduction and a motivational short film 'Piper' and explained about emulation. She showed a video on receptivity in childhood and made the project personnel aware of the type of care and environment that should be provided for children during childhood. She discussed on the RTE Amendment 2017 and the progress report which will be provided to the students after the completion of their studies in each class. S.A Moin discussed on learning outcomes of the children after being taught by the teachers. He had a power point presentation and explained what should be learnt by a child from 1st to 7th class in Hindi, in English and in Maths.

The participants actively participated in the session and shared their experiences and challenges that they face while implementing the activities especially while collecting the information from the teachers regarding the punctuality and



regularity of children in school. Mr. S.A. Moin noted the names of the villages, blocks and districts where this programme will be implemented and assured the participants that UNICEF will help in solving the problem of schools' non-cooperation to Mashal's staff in their efforts of reducing the rate of dropouts and of promoting retention of girls in schools.

Program Developments of Main Activities

Objective 1: Awareness Generation on girls' education and RTE, with specific focus on reducing dropout

Activities:

a) One-day-training on RTE to 2,000 CBO women from the villages of 3 districts

Process:

Though the budget was for only 2000 women 2,038 women participated in the one-day training from 50 villages of East and West Champaran Districts and 30 villages from Sheikhpura District, The training was conducted in 39 batches. Approximately, 50 CBO women participated in each batch. MSK conducted 20 batches of training for the CBO women of Sheikhpura district. Pragati Rural Development conducted 12 batches of training for the CBO women of East Champaran and West Champaran villages. Cheshta conducted 7 batches of training for the CBO women of Raxual villages. The CBO women were made aware of the importance of girls' education through short films on the importance of girls' education and a documentary on RTE.

During the training discussions were held on RTE and on its key messages. The important points discussed with the women were as follows:

- All children of age 6 to 14 are entitled to get free and compulsory education
- Duties of school teachers,
- Number of working days in the school, number of working hours in the schools,



- School facilities like separate toilets for girls, mid day meal, drinking water, library, playground, boundary wall, free books for children, scholarship, free school uniform and money for sanitary napkins etc.
- Progress reports after the completion of a class for the children.
- The importance of regular attendance of children in the class, what is the percentage of children's attendance a must for availing scholarship etc,
- Formation of SMC/VSS, total members in the SMC/VSS, roles and responsibility of SMC/VSS
- How schools are supported through VSS.
- Parents' role towards Children's right to education and how they can monitor their children's studies
- The new schemes like Mukhiya Mantri Kanya Uthaan Yojana, Cycle Yojana etc.

The CBO women actively participated in the training and gained knowledge and information to enhance the education of their children. They were made aware of the importance of sending their children regularly and on time to school. They came to know the role of SMC (school management committee) in reducing dropout rate and increasing the attendance and punctuality of their children. The training very specially focused on the different government schemes of education, especially for girls. Bihar governments started Kanya Utthan Yojana for increasing the literacy rate of girls and reducing child marriage; women also came to know about other government schemes and became aware of how to get them. The women showed their willingness to take initiatives to meet the teachers and other school officers concerned for improving the education of their children.

b) One-day Tola meeting on RTE with villagers to sensitize them on RTE and to identify the barriers faced by girls not attending school regularly and on time

Tola meeting was an important activity to make large number of villagers and the community members aware of the importance of education of their children. In the tola meeting, women, men and youth, all together participated and shared their views for promoting education of their children particularly how to reduce the dropouts and to increase the number of school going children on time and regular. The Objectives the meeting are the following:



- To impart the key messages of RTE and its amendment in 2017 for ensuring their active participation to improve the educational status of their children
- To create awareness of the importance of girls' education with specific focus on reducing dropout of girl children
- To motivate the community members to monitor the performance of their schools
- To sensitize the parents to send their children especially girls regular and on time to school
- To motivate the community members to build good rapport with the teachers and SMC members for improving the quality of education in the villages.
- To make the community members aware of government schemes for the school going children

Process:

The tola meeting was conducted in 80 villages/hamlets. 9,597 villagers participated in the meeting conducted in different dates. In East Champaran and West Champaran, tola meeting was conducted in the evening and in Sheikhpura, a Mobile van was hired with flex board fittings for



Tola meetings. Both ideas were very creative and positive to make large number of rural population aware of the key messages of RTE. The motivational videos, documentary, reflective discussions helped the villagers to participate actively in the meeting. In number of tola meetings, school principals, teachers, and PRI members also participated. The village community assembled to listen to the powerful message on how they could do to change the future of the village by improving education programmes by their skilful and critical observation and monitoring especially in the government schools. In the discussion, women complained that men are responsible for dropout and irregularity of children in school. Men don't want that girls go to school and they don't allow their girls to go anywhere; sometimes they also beat the mothers if they send their girls for training and cultural programmes. But some men also said that women are responsible for dropout and irregularity of children in the school, especially of girls because they want that their girls learn all the household work for their future family life and care for their in-laws. After watching the motivational videos and discussion on the benefits of education for girls and boys, they realised that they are wrong and they should send their children to school regularly and on time. Villagers also were motivated to monitor the school system for their children's better education. They also came to know about the different government schemes which have been started especially for girls. Several women and men want to know how to avail the benefits of these schemes.



Impact

Villagers have no job opportunity except agricultural work, so often they migrate to other states for searching for jobs and there they face more problems due to their illiteracy. When they were made aware on RTE and importance and benefits of education, several villagers realised that they are responsible for the dark future of their children, especially girls. The tola meeting had a positive effect; it was seen in village of Shayampur kotraha, Nautan. From this village, 28 girls were admitted in the school. In Dera tola and Sarey Banjari Patti, children alleged that parents don't send them to school but take them along for working in brick kilns, sowing, harvesting and sometimes they were asked to take care of their house. But after the tola meeting many parents started to send their children to school. Some parents argued on why they should send

their children to school, when the teachers don't teach, they said that if the teachers will teach properly, they surely send their children to school.

Challenges:

- There is no cooperation or motivation from those families who are already educated in the same village and the same caste. The mind set of certain people regarding the education of girls remains the same. Even after making lots of efforts to convince them, they don't cooperate, particularly for high school education. Most of the children drop out after class eight. Many people have a big concern about the safety of girls as the high school is far from their villages.
- Another challenge is that if any incident of runaway cases or love affair occurs with any girl, girls of the whole village are prevented from going to school. They are almost in house arrest.
- Several parents want that whatever has to be improved in the school and the school system has to be done by the government and it is not their responsibility; they don't want to do anything.
- Some SC groups still lag behind in educating their children, because if their children learn a little bit but don't get any job, then, they would not work in brick-kiln or do any similar work, which they are doing for livelihood so they keep away their children from schooling.

Objective 2: Sensitizing girls on the importance of education and building self-confidence and motivation to make decision regarding their right to education

Activities:

a) One-day-workshop on RTE for the adolescent girls at block level

In Gahiri: One day workshop on RTE was conducted on 28th November, 2018 at Victoria Mission School Gahiri. **277 girls** participated in the workshop from 30 villages of East and West Champaran. The unit invited many government officers from Nautan block and Paharpur block. The Chief guest was Bindewsari Prasad (Block Education officer, Paharpur), and other guests were Sataya Narayan Prasad



(Principal of high School, South Telhua), Jai Lal Sah (Cluster resource person, Nautan block), Ms. Vandana (Programme coordinator, Mashal) and some teachers from high school, South Telhua and all the personnel from Victoria Mission. The girls wore orange head bands and shouted slogans on the power of education. The workshop depicted the importance of girls' education through and dramas, folk dances, motivational songs and speeches. One street play was on the life of a girl, who fought in the society and family for education and achieved her goal. The Block officer deliberated a speech on the importance of girls' education, and shared his family experience and motivated the girls to achieve higher education. Programme coordinator as a resource person made girls aware on gender discrimination and how this discrimination stops the mobility and development of girls and women and how they can break through it with education. The girls were very happy to take a pledge to complete their higher education and realize their dream.

In Raxual: One day workshop on RTE was conducted on 1st Dec, 2018 in the campus of CHESHTA. **258** girls participated from the 20 villages of Raxual. The Chief guest was Mr. Satish Chandra Shrivastav (Block education officer, Raxual), and other guests were Mr. Kumar Prashant (Block Development Officer, Raxual), Mukhiya (Siswa), Ranjan Singh (SSB of Raxual), Srs. Anjana, Pawana, Karishma, Ms. Sarita, and Organization's staff and several teachers of Notre Dame school. The girls took a rally wearing orange head bands and shouted slogans on the power of RTE. In the



workshop, Mr. Satish Chandra Shrivastav appreciated the work of Mashal and he shared the situation and status of girls without education and motivated the girls towards education and the importance of going to school regularly and on time. A few girls shared their experiences of the three-day life skill training and they told that they will say no to child marriage and complete their higher education and achieve their goal. Many motivational songs and street plays on girls' education were presented by girls.

In Sheikhpura:

One day workshop on RTE was conducted on 9th December, 2018 at MSK (Mahila Shikshan Kendra). **366** girls participated from 30 villages from Sheikhpura and Ariari blocks. The unit invited the Block Education Officer and some respectable officers but nobody came because it was a Sunday. Sr. Udaya, Sr. Suprabha, federation members and organization's staff participated in this workshop. During the workshop, Sr. Udaya spoke on the importance of girls' education and motivated the girls to complete their higher education. The street plays and folk songs were presented by the girls depicted the importance of education. A few mothers shared their views on their children's education and motivated the girls to attend school regularly and on time. A quiz competition on General Knowledge was conducted and prizes were given to the winners. The girls enthusiastically participated in the workshop.



Impact

A total of 896 girls participated in the workshop from the respective areas of Sheikhpura, Gahiri and Raxual. Though the girls from the deprived communities were never given an opportunity of presenting a stage show, speaking some lines on the importance of girls, singing folk songs, dancing etc., but there was an increase in their confidence level while presenting programmes on the stage; girls boldly presented the role play on "*Mujhe bhi padhana hai*". A few girls shared their experiences of the life skill training and other activities and expressed an increase in their level of knowledge and self confidence.

b) Three-day Life Skills Training for the adolescent girls (residential)

A Three-day life skills-training was conducted for 704 girls from the respective villages of the intervention areas in 20 batches, each batch consisting of 35-40 girls. MSK, Sheikhpura conducted eight batches, Pragati Rural Development, Gahiri conducted six batches and CHESHTA, Raxual also conducted six batches of training. Each batch of training started with Yoga, motivational story and recitation of the preamble of the Indian Constitution. The first session was an introductory session, in which girls were formed into groups by a game of making the sound of a particular animal or bird. This session was an ice-breaking session, as through this game, girls began to feel comfortable and gave their introduction to the group. They were asked about their expectations from the training and of their dreams. Chart papers, notebooks, colours and pens were given to the girls for writing, drawing and painting. Videos, games, motivational stories, songs role play etc. were used during the training to make the learning more interesting and joyful for the girls. The training focused on ten life skills, which are laid down by the WHO as follows:

1. Self-awareness	2. Empathy
3. Coping with stress	4. Creative thinking
5. Critical thinking	6. Interpersonal relationship
7. Coping with emotion	8. Problem Solving
9. Decision making	10. Effective communication

Self-Awareness: This skill helps the adolescents to understand themselves and come to know their personal identity. Due to lack of information and skill they find hard to decide what they want. During this session, girls complete an exercise, in which they write down what their dreams are, what they want to learn, what they like and dislike, who their ideal leader is, about child rights etc. This exercise supports the girls so that they know themselves.



Empathy: This skill helps them to learn how to feel with others and help them. During the training, they are shown a video, and are made to play a street drama which enhances the sense of learning on how to feel with others and help them.

Coping with Stress:

In the age of adolescence, children become very sensitive and thus often become stressed and prone to negative thinking. This skill helps them to enhance their understanding level on how to cope with stress. They are shown the video of Komal and Meena, through which they learn how to cope with stress.



Creative Thinking: Creative thinking is a novel way of seeing or doing things. The girls are shown a story chart and asked to develop the story by themselves.

They are asked to create a story and write it down in their copy book. They are also asked to draw and colour the characters in the stories like two seeds, lamps and rainbow in their note book and write down the qualities of these characters that they like in them. In this exercise, they develop their creative thinking.

Critical Thinking: This skill helps to enhance the knowledge and ability to analyse information and experience in an objective manner. Through it, according to the situation, one learns how to face problems and handle any situation. Children are asked

watch the Monkey and the crocodile's story and a game through which they learn about the skills of critical thinking.

Interpersonal Relationship: Interpersonal relationship is a very important skill for adolescents to have social relations with parents, friends, and relatives in the family in the school and society. Children are shown video 'Ekta me bal hai' and they play a game through which they learn about interpersonal relationships. Through it, they enhance their knowledge of having positive and healthy relationships with others including peers. They understand the importance of mutual respect and socially defined boundaries of every relationships.

Coping with Emotion: Often during this age, adolescents have frequent mood swings reflecting feelings of anger, sadness, happiness, fear, shame, guilt and love. Very often, they are unable to understand the emotional turmoil. Through the story of 'Rupa's Meaningless Sacrifice', children learn how to cope with emotion.

Problem Solving: This skill develops the understanding of children to deal with problems constructively in their lives. Children are shown a documentary and a video related to problem solving and a game in which they learn about problem solving skills.

Decision Making: This skill helps them to make right decisions about their lives.

Children are shown a video of Tony and Donkey and a game in which they themselves take decisions to say what those children do who do not go to school and who go to school daily and on time. Through it, they enhance their thinking level and learn why they should go to school daily and the benefits of education.

Effective Communication: This skill develops the understanding level on the means of effective communication so that the children are able to express themselves, both verbally and non-verbally, be a good listener, have a good body language and eye contact, respect other's feelings, and speak confidently. Through role play, they are taught the ways of effective communication.



The girls who participated in the training were exposed to various activities. It was fascinating for them to learn without their regular books. The Life skills training has given them the required direction to change their life for better and adopt new ideas in relating, communicating, and to form good habits.

The girls were asked to review the content of each day by questions related to the activities of the whole day. On the last day, the girls were asked how they felt about the training and being with other girls. They were also asked to share what they learnt the training. The girls were confident and happy and gave satisfactory answers.



Impact

Total 704 girls were trained through this programme and were motivated to go to school every day and on time and to complete their higher education. Through the life skills sessions, girls learnt what affects their self-esteem and what they need to do build their self-esteem, assertiveness and decision-making capacity and how to balance their emotions. They gained knowledge of good touch and bad touch and what to do when they face abuse. The training led to increase self-awareness and self-confidence in girls.



From the 704 participants,

- 2 girls were identified as out of school and 18 girls were identified as dropout and 2 girls were identified as irregular in Gahiri
- 14 girls were identified as dropouts and 12 girls were identified as irregular in Raxual

- 17 girls were identified as dropouts and 14 girls were identified as irregular in Sheikhpura

Note from resource persons:

- During the three-day life skills training, the resource person observed that the girls who participated in the training had never gone to any type of training before, they were deprived of basic facilities and had not received any opportunity earlier for developing and expressing their skills and qualities.
- Several girls used colours for the first time
- On the first day, majority of the children silently sat in the class but at the end of the training most of the children became very vocal, expressive and confident in sharing their qualities in street play, drawing, learning and telling stories, and signing etc.
- Every child has lots of potential; if she gets a chance to develop this potential through quality education
- Each batch had 2-3 girls who were very creative and high learning capacity but they had no opportunity to complete their education
- Several girls had passed 8th class, and were admitted in class 9 but in the school there is no teaching so they go for coaching
- Resource person observed that although the girls are going to school and are students from 4th to 10th class, they were not able to write properly or read simple words.
- Several girls complained that teachers come regularly to school but don't teach them



Challenges

- The staff who brought them from home found it very difficult to convince the parents as the parents feel it is not necessary for girls to go for any further learning. They treat them as someone who is going to leave the house so there is no need to free them for any learning. They also feel afraid of sending the girls out of their homes.
- During this period, due to the news of some incidents at some shelter homes, the villagers didn't want to send their girls for the residential training.

- During the training, some parents came continuously to meet their children, and pressurised the staff to allow them to take their children home.

Objective 3: Mapping of out of school, dropout and children vulnerable to becoming school drop out

a) Collecting the data of out of school, dropout and children vulnerable to becoming school dropout through observing school registers, discussion with teachers and CBO women.

A door to door survey was conducted in 39 village/hamlets to identify irregular, out of school or dropout girl children of the age group 06-14 of the villages according to a format provided by UNICEF. The animators also met teachers and held discussions to identify the dropout and irregular girl children. They also conducted CBO meeting and discussed with the women to identify the out of school and dropout and irregular children of their villages. In the tola meetings and in the trainings discussions were held to identify the girls who are out of school, dropout and irregular. In Sheikhpura 50 girls, from East Champaran in the block of Paharpur and Raxual 126 girls and Nautan block of West Champaran 16 girls were identified as dropouts. A total of 115 girls were identified as out of school- 25 girls from Paharpur block, 59 girls from Raxual block of East Champaran and 31 girls from Nautan block of West Champaran. 30 irregular girls were identified in Sheikhpura block.

Getting out of school and dropout children enrolled in schools

The animators with the help of parents and CBO women admitted/readmitted the identified dropout and out of school girls in their respective area schools. 50 girls from Sheikhpura, 126 girls from Paharpur and Raxual block from East Champaran and 16 girls from Nautan block from West Champaran were readmitted. And 115 girls were newly admitted in school, 25 girls from Paharpur block and 59 girls from Raxual block from East Champaran, 31 girls from Nautan block from West Champaran.

BBOSE Linkage:

From the dropout girls who have passed class 8, 13 girls are linked to BBOSE (Bihar Board of Open Schooling and Examination) from West Champaran (Nautan Block). They had left school after 8th class because their parents did not allow them to study further. The animators motivated these girls to complete their class 10 by BBOSE. They convinced their parents and took admission though it was a long process. The BBOSE

centre, Janta Ucchya Vidyalay, Telhua, block Nautan where all 13 girls took admission, could not provide study materials so the unit in-charge Sister with the help of UNICEF collected the study materials from Patna and provided them to the girls. Now these girls are attending an intensive coaching in Victoria Mission School, Gahiri given by the principal and the teachers of the school. The



girls are very happy to study there and complete their matriculation.

Developing community members, especially parents as support and pressure group for education in the village

The programme focused on reducing the dropout rate and irregularity of children in school. The villagers were made aware on the key messages of RTE and the importance of girls' education through tola meetings and training on RTE to the CBO women using several motivational videos, documentaries and reflective discussions. Several parents and community members realized that they are responsible for illiteracy and lack of education of their children. The life skills training motivated the girls to demand their right to education from their parents. Several mothers promised to send their children to school every day and on time. Some parents, especially mothers, reached the school for meeting the principals and teachers, but their experiences were

bad in Gahiri Man tola, Dera Tola, Raxual Kaunadhangar and village Dhrampur, Sheikhpura. They complained to the Programme coordinator when she met them during the field visit, but some CBO women from Akauna village, Panchayat Gagri, District Sheikhpua reached Rajkiye Primary School, Akauna, after getting motivated in the one day training; they met Principal Sanjay Kumar and the teachers and talked about their children and their studies. In Raxual, some parents reached school on 5th September on the celebration of Teachers' Day and appreciated the teachers for their responsibilities and discussed with them regarding to their children's study habits.

Several parents admitted or readmitted their children after attending the training on RTE. In Gahiri, Sister made the villagers aware of Kasturba School where they won't have to pay anything for the education of their girls so five girls were admitted in Kasturba School from Paharpur, East Champaran. Several parents demanded an SMC meeting from the principal and came to know the names of SMC members. Some women told that they started to check their children's notebooks and allot time for studies. These are some of the positive signs and to sustain these signs of progress community mobilization for motivation and participation to be continued for improving the education of their children.

Collection of Human Interest Stories:

During the project implementation, a special focus was given to collect a number of case studies from the target communities on the impact and influence of the activities on the communities for retention of children especially girls in the school, enrollment and re-enrollment of girls children, behavioral changes of children going to school and the parents and communities, who have played extra ordinary roles in improving the educational status of their children.

The case studies are processed by the programme coordinator after the collection of the case studies with the help of the Unit staff. Unit staff personally met the parents after each tola meeting, CBO training and life skill training and talked to the parents and community members. They motivated the parents and supported them for their children's admission, readmission or retention. Total thirty six case studies came from the respective areas where the programme was implemented.

Monitoring and Review:

Monitoring and review measures were planned carefully to achieve the expected results through an effective implementation process of the project. There were daily field visit by the animators, activity based visit by the unit in- charge sisters and a quarterly visit by the coordinator from the centre. Monthly meeting and quarterly meeting with the animators were conducted to review the progress of the programme.

All three units - Cheshta, Pragati Rural Development and Mahila Shikshan Kendra conducted a meeting every month with the animators and assessed the process and development of the activities based on the objective outcomes. The unit in-charge



sisters went to the field for guiding and monitoring the activities and interacted with villagers and CBO women. They made the CBO women and villagers aware of the importance of girls' education by discussing with them and motivated them by sharing several examples of their life experiences. The animators played very important role in the implementation of the project. They collected the data of out of school, dropout and irregular girls of the villages and met the parents of those children and convinced them to main stream the children to school. During the monthly meetings, field information was given to the unit in-charge sisters for further planning for better results. They prepared monthly reports and sent to the head office for preparing the compiled report. The Sisters also personally met several parents and convinced them to send their children to school regularly and on time.

Field visit of the Program coordinator:

All three units of Mashal were monitored and guided by the program coordinator and project director. During the field visit the coordinator participated in the life skill training, CBO meetings, Tola meetings and Workshops on RTE. She met the CBO women and villagers during her field visit. The tola meetings, CBO trainings and Life skill training became very effective because after these activities the coordinator met many parents and convinced them to send their children to school. The impact of these visits was that several girls got admitted or readmitted in the school. The girls who were not going to school regularly and on time started to go to school. Many women started to send their children but they were not happy with the government school education system, so they were pressurizing the coordinator to talk to the principals and teachers for providing

quality education. She motivated the CBO women to organize themselves and act collectively for improving the education system of their villages. She met many teachers in the schools and requested them to cooperate with the villagers and CBOs to improve the attendance of children and reduce the out of school and dropout rate of children.

The challenges faced in the field:

- The patriarchal society is not able to digest that girls are breaking the stereotypes and becoming educated. The parents create several excuses for not sending the girls in the training or to school. Sometimes rumours were spread that the NGOs are engaged in human trafficking and organ harvesting. Sometimes, the trainers themselves reached the field for motivating the parents for sending their daughters to the life skill training.
- Some mothers sent their daughters to the life skill training in the absence of their husbands, but after their husbands returned home and came to know, they beat their wives and also abused the animators.
- Sometimes, the girls' fathers reached the training centre and demanded that their daughters be sent with them. Those people were convinced with great difficulty to allow the girls to attend the training.
- Every school had a VSS/SMC but they are not functioning, so the children don't know where to complain about the problems that they face regarding their right to education
- VSS/ SMC members don't know about their work.
- The teachers do not want to give the proof of readmission of children in their school due to some hidden reason.
- Several parents argued during the tola meeting, especially the male persons, that there was no benefit in educating their daughters. If they educate their daughters, they wouldn't want to work in the field and take care of their animals.
- Some parents were more worried for their daughters especially in the Mushar community that if their daughters go to school and something happen to them, who would care.
- The tola sevaks do not carry out their duty sincerely to improve the attendance of the children in the school of their tolas.
- Several girls were admitted and readmitted in schools, but neither the teachers teach properly nor come on time. The teachers themselves told the children to go for coaching.
- The children didn't get the money for the books and the uniforms on time
- There is no joyful teaching learning taking place in the school
- Many families migrate for work especially during harvesting

Conclusion

Though there were many challenges in the field, the implementing team put in a lot of efforts to achieve the expected results of the programme. The team organized the activities according to the convenience of the communities and used interesting and motivational learning methods to impart knowledge and information to people. They had good rapport with the villagers and were committed to accompany the marginalized communities for bringing change especially in educating their children. Several of the villagers supported the work of spreading awareness on RTE and started to send their children to school regularly. Even though, the gender biased society doesn't want to educate girls, the awakened women and girls started to break the stereotype beliefs and assert themselves to realize their rights. It is just the beginning; still they need accompaniment and solidarity for their emancipation.

Mashal's collaboration with UNICEF through the project 'Community Based Initiative on Ensuring Enrolment of Dropouts and Retention of Children in Schools' brought behavioral and attitudinal changes in majority of the people of 80 villages towards RTE to their children. 11,635 parents and community members have increased their knowledge and awareness on RTE and the importance of Girls' Education. 233 girls vulnerable to becoming school dropouts are identified and supported, 308 out of School and dropout girls are mapped and enrolled in different schools, around 40% of parents started to monitor the attendance and punctuality of their children going to school. 704 adolescent girls are sensitized on their right to education and are motivated to attend school regularly.

Mashal team is happy for the outcome of the nine months of mobilization of the rural marginalized communities for ensuring enrolment of dropouts and retention of girls in schools. Mashal is also happy for the timely support and guidance given by UNICEF team for implementing the programme effectively.

Sangita Kumari belongs to a poor family from a Dalit community. She has one younger sister and two younger brothers. Sangita is the eldest one among all her sisters and brothers. Her younger sister goes to Aganwadi Kendra and brothers are very young. Sangita's father lives out of station for livelihood and her mother is a house wife and she takes care of the house and she has four children to care for. Under the UNICEF programme, Pragati Rural Development conducted one day training on RTE; Sangita's mother also participated in this training.



During the training, women were motivated towards the right to education, especially girl's education. At the end of the training, Sangita's mother told that her daughter Sangita doesn't go to school because she is the eldest one among all children and nobody is there in the house to care for the younger children and to support her in household work. The Unit in-charge sister and some CBO women from her village convinced her for sending Sangita to school. She agreed to send her daughter to school but she told that someone should support her to admit her daughter to school. After the CBO training, one of the animators went to Rajkiya Utkarmit Madhya Vidyalay Pratap tola with Sangita's mother and admitted Sangita in the school. The unit in-charge sister told the animator to monitor Sangita's

attendance in the school. He reported that Sangita is going to school regularly. Sangita is very happy and she told that she would regularly attend the class.

Kajal Kumari belongs to a poor family. She has one sister and three elder brothers, who live out of the districts. Kajal is the youngest one among all her sisters and brothers. Her house is made of weed. Under the UNICEF programme, Pragati Rural Development conducted one day training on RTE; Kajal's mother also participated in the training. In the training, CBO women were made aware of RTE and the benefits of girls' education and showed some motivational video on why one



should educate the girls. After watching the video, one or two women told about Kajal and Kajal's mother. Kajal's mother told that her daughter is the youngest one among all her children and due to carelessness, she doesn't want to go to school, and she left the school after class 1. Resource persons and other women tried to convince her that if she does not care for her and her education, her future would get worse, nobody would care for her and she would always depend on others for reading or writing something. Kajal's mother agreed that all of them were saying the right thing. The unit in-charge sister and an animator went to Kajal's house continuously for a couple of days and convinced her to go to school. A few days later Kajal was ready to go to school. Several women raised their hands but Anshu's mother didn't raise her hand, she told she doesn't send her daughter to school but her two sons are going to school, as she had no money to send all the children to school and in government school, teachers don't teach the children well. Her daughter is learning household work at home. The resource person tried to convince her. Firstly, how she knew that in government school teachers don't teach and secondly her daughter would learn cooking, sowing, harvesting and so many other works but when she (the girl) would go anywhere, she wouldn't be able to read the train schedule at the station and for any official work she would be depending like her mother on a literate person. The resource person asked her whether she wanted her daughter to be like her or lead a better life. She remained silent and after some times she told that they had no money for books and other materials which are needed for studying.



The resource person told that she would not have to expend money for girls' education, and in the school she (her daughter) would learn something and have a better future. The mother got convinced and was ready to send her daughter to school and told that the next day she would admit her daughter in the school. The next day the animator went to her house to see if she is going to school for admitting her daughter or not. The animator did not find them in the house; the neighbours told him that Anshu and her mother had gone to the school for admission. The animator reached the school and he saw Anshu and her mother in front of the principal for admission. Anshu got admitted in Rajkiye Utkarmit Madhya Vidyalay, Manjhariya. Anshu is going to school daily and is very happy to make her future bright.

The animator monitored Angura for going school regularly and on time for a couple of days. Angura is very happy to reach school on time and attend class regularly.

We have no money to send our children to a private school our children go to school regularly, they will be able to read and write. Rani got readmitted in Buniyadi School, Telhua in 6th class. I want to send her to school now". The animator helped Arti's mother to get Arti newly admitted in Rajkiye Uttkarnit Madhay Vidyalaya, Majhariya in the 5th class according to her age. Listening to it, her mother got angry and said," What will she do after studying? I already got two daughters married. After 2-3 years later, I will get her married too. The resource

person calmed down Rekha's mother and continued the training. In the training, the CBO women were made aware of and motivated them, through motivational videos, towards girls' education, RTE and government schemes which have been started especially for girls. At the end of the training, the resource person discussed on girls' education and asked one question – how many CBO women could fill the bank form themselves and how many women teach their children. Nobody raised their hands. The resource person made them aware and convinced them of the benefits of girls' education. After that she again asked Rekha's mother, "Even now you wouldn't send Rekha to school?" Rekha's mother was ready to readmit Rekha in school. After a few days Rekha's mother with the help of an animator Rekha was readmitted in Rajkiya Uttkarnit Madhya Vidyalay in class 5. She told her friends that she would like to become a teacher.

Success Story of Tola Meeting

This story is from Shayampur Kotrahan Harijan Tola, Panchayat Shayampur Kotrahan, Post Kotrahan, P. S Nautan, District West Champaran. This tola consists of almost 150 to 200 houses of SC (Mushar) community and almost all family members are daily wage labourers in the land of landlords. Under the programme, this tola had a special focus due to high rates of dropout girls and of out of school girls. Most of the girls of this tola were not going to school, some girls had stopped studying after Class 2 or 3 and some girls never went to school because they also go with their mothers for sowing and harvesting. Most of the girls take care of their siblings, and their parents are not bothered about their children's education, because they are also illiterate. The one-day tola meeting was conducted in this tola in the evening



and people were shown motivational videos on the importance of girls' education and RTE awareness and they discussed on the benefits of education in their life. Since the meeting was conducted in the evening most of the villagers came and participated in the meeting. The tola meeting had a great effect on the villagers. In the discussion most of the villagers agreed that girls should go to school. They promised the Resource persons that they would send their daughters to school. The next day, two animators again reached this tola and asked the parents, who were ready to send their girls to meet the headmaster of the school for getting their children admitted in the school. In

the month of September and October 2018, there were 28 girls admitted or readmitted in the Rajkiye Uttkarnit Madhya Vidhyalay, Shayampur Kotrahan. After some time, the animator went to see if those girls are going to school or not, the girls met the animator but they complained that the teachers do not teach them properly and some time they use abusive words. Right now, these girls are going to school but if this situation continues, girls will become irregular and finally they become dropouts again. The efforts of Mashal and the money spent by UNICEF both will be wasted due to careless and improper teaching of the teachers.

Before two years, all sisters and brothers were studying but after her sister's marriage, a loan burden came on her father so due to crises of money, one brother left his studies and migrated out of state. Suruchi stopped going to school and started to support her mother in the field and also to prepare the food and do other works at home. During the one-day tola meeting on RTE, the animator came to know about Suruchi Kumari left the school. He reached Suruchi's house to talk to her parents. The animator talked to them for sending Suruchi to school again but they were not interested. The animator tried to convince them but they didn't agree. That day, the animator admitted six girls in the



school in Manipur Rajkiye Madhaya Vidyalay. When Suruchi saw that those girls who were playing every day were going to school, she was very upset and told her father that she would also go to school. She insisted her parents to send her to school. When MSK animator met Suruchi, she asked him regarding the procedure of readmission. She told her parents that the following day MSK animator would take her to school for admission and asked her mother to accompany her. In the next day, Suruchi Kumari and her mother, along with the animator went to school and readmitted Suruchi in class 8 in Rajkiye Madhaya Vidyalay, Manipur. She is going to school every day and she is very happy to continue her studies.

The animator of MSK keeps in contact with the parents of Nibha for motivating them to send Nibha to school regularly and on time. But her elder brother who attended the tola meeting supported the animator and convinced his parents to send Rupa to school. Finally her parents were ready but they not willing to go to school for readmitting Rupa. So Rupa's elder brother took Rupa to Urdu Primary Vidyalaya, Hasuadi, which was near her house and readmitted Rupa in class 4. During the survey, the MSK animators came to know that Bharti had never gone to school and she only attends tuition near her house. The MSK animator met her parents and convinced



her parents to admit Bharti in school but her parents were not happy to send Bharti to school. Her father said that school is useless, there is no teaching going on and there is no benefit of sending children to school. The animator tried to convince him that if Bharti would go to school regularly and have seventy five percent attendances then, she would get scholarship and other facilities. Her father lived out of state so he never attended the meeting and didn't know any rules and regulations about RTE. The animators made several visits to this family and finally Bharti's father got convinced to send his daughter to school and admitted her in Rajkiye Uttkarmit Urdu Primary School in class 5. 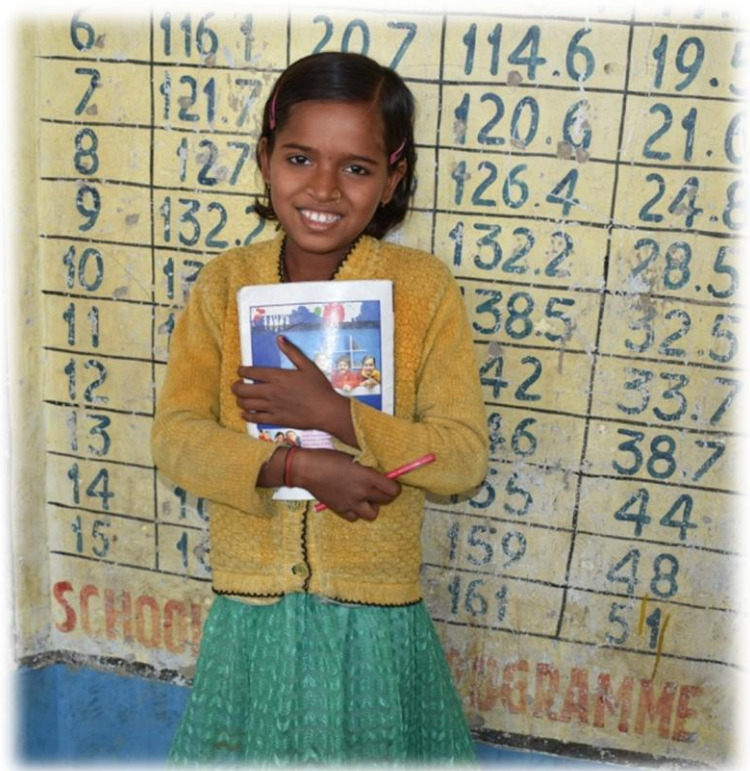

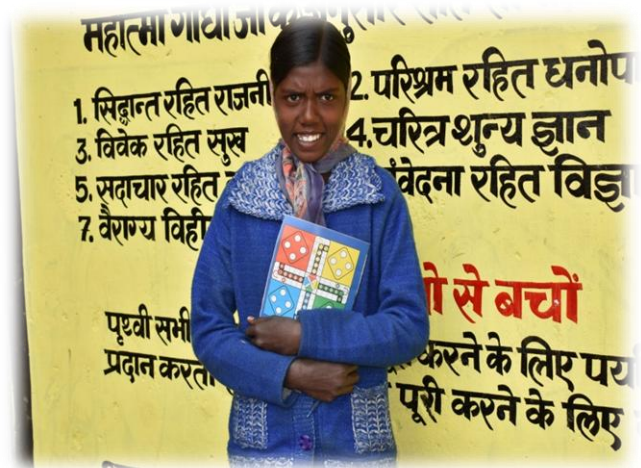

The CBO women told the resource person that Phul Kumari is not going to school regularly. When the resource person asked Phul Kumari's mother about her child's education, she told that she wanted all of her children to be educated but no one was there to care for her house after her elder daughter got married. The resource person told her that if she supports

her daughter in the house hold work then her daughter could continue her studies otherwise she would remain uneducated. Her mother said that she would try to send her daughter to school on time. After a few days the animator visited Phul Kumaris house to see whether she is going to school and found that she is going to school happily with the other girls. After some time, the programme coordinator also visited the school and found Phul Kumari in the school.
